

Woodcroft Christian Centre Smokefree Policy

Purpose

This policy has been developed to protect all employees, service users, customers and visitors from exposure to secondhand smoke and to assist compliance with the Health Act 2006.

Exposure to secondhand smoke, also known as passive smoking, increases the risk of lung cancer, heart disease and other illnesses. Ventilation or separating smokers and non-smokers within the same airspace does not completely stop potentially dangerous exposure.

Policy

It is the policy of Woodcroft Christian Centre that all of our Buildings are smoke free and all Guests and employees have a right to a smoke free environment. The policy shall come into effect on 26th March 2007 and be reviewed Annually by the manager

Smoking is prohibited throughout all buildings with no exceptions. This policy applies to all employees, contractors, customers and visitors.

Implementation

Overall responsibility for policy implementation and review rests with The Centre Manager. All Group Leaders and Woodcroft Christian Centre employees are obliged to adhere to, and facilitate the implementation of the policy.

The person named above shall inform all existing employees, contractors and group leaders of the policy and their role in the implementation and monitoring of the policy. They'll also have to give all new personnel a copy of the policy on recruitment/induction.

Appropriate 'No smoking' signs will be clearly displayed at the entrances to and within the premises.

Non-compliance

Local disciplinary procedures should be followed if a member of staff does not comply with this policy. Those who do not comply with the smoking law are also liable to a fixed penalty fine and possible criminal prosecution.
